

Preface

This book would provide clarity on the nature of our world using intriguing analysis of codes hidden in a Christmas carol (The twelve days of Christmas).

The concepts expressed in this book would give a better perspective of film reviews available on the website (<https://www.filmnoir.ca/>), and help the reader better comprehend the issues and analysis provided on blog.

Ideas provided in this book are based on trance revelations backed up with research from various online sources (see appendix) and it aims to develop a general awareness on the nature of our humanity and the direction our world should really take.

The '12 Days of Christmas' is a pre-historic coded message that provides warnings against global warming and gender discrimination. It is a message from God or Mother Earth, and it is based on the real-life experiences of the author.

Each line from the carol is presented at the beginning of each chapter, followed by an analytical review of the coded message behind the carol's words. It's a fun read to the intelligent mind.

Introduction

While compiling Christmas carols on my DJ equipments on the 23rd night of December 2019, a great trance fell upon me. Although, this was not new to me, because I have fallen under trances before caused by my spirit man 'Ogun'. Ogun is the Edo (Nigeria) tribal God of Thunder and lighting. Thus, I became intrigued by the Christmas carol titled '12 days of Christmas'.

From that day and for the next 13 days I was awoken by the spirit with a message in my mind and I used online research to develop and understand the messages.

I'd wake and write on the '12 days of Christmas' for 3 hours every night with each night per day of the carol. At that time in my locality, electric power was rationed per 3 hours i.e. power on from 3am to 6am, then off from 6am to 9am round the clock.

The research and writing lasted 13 days because on the 5th day (December 27th, 2019), I was spiritually attacked by evil forces which were trying to prevent my revelations to humanity. I had to speak in tongues to rebuke an evil presence from my house. I heard myself chant these strange words; '*Ah bu da da bu da da bu da da bie, be rebuked*'. I was a bit scared, but I also felt protected and saved. Thankfully I could go on till I completed the twelve days.

I hope these revelations mean something important to the reader.

Day 1

On the first day of Christmas, my true love said to me, 'and a partridge in a pear tree'.

True Love – The feminine gender is purposefully made weaker and more flexible than the males to assist procreation responsibilities (Childbearing).

Therefore, in the beginning there was a general concession that the woman would not be oppressed or taken advantage of by the stronger male gender. There was a promise to the woman that she would have freedom to love whom she pleases.

True love, therefore, is freedom, not an enslaving commitment but freedom to decide regardless of societal systems.

The Partridge - This is a non-migratory bird found in Asia, Europe and Africa. The term '*non-migratory*' implies that its habitat needs to be preserved. The pear tree can be seen as a representation of the natural habitat of the bird.

The non-migratory partridge is a proverbial reference to the 'true kings or queens' who were originally programmed and placed in various regions around the world.

Another way to understand the concept of true kings or queens is the distribution of the races across the world, with each king or queen representing a race.

The racial distribution served to identify natural positions in the world and express variety in humanity. In present times these differences are supposed to be expressed in various cultures and traditions, scientific innovations, or unique design concepts, etc. There truly was a beautiful divine plan for humanity.

Unfortunately, racial differences lead to violence expressed in wars as each true king or queen tried to defend their natural position in the world.

War or violence was sustained even in the face of seemingly impossible feats, for example, the Spartan 300.

Under divine programming the true kings or queens had a desire to ascend the heavens, and in primitive times, these desires were sometimes cruelly expressed.

Cruelly, because most of them relied on slave labor to undertake impossible constructions in attempts to ascend the heavens without the use of proper modern technology. Thus, the title of wicked or mad king or queen became associated with those rulers who went against the odds to achieve a heavenly status.

Some archaeological evidence or historical accounts of such seemingly impossible constructions include the pyramids of Egypt, and the Tower of Babel. Just think about historic technology or innovations that were far ahead of their time and must have required serious slave labor or risk to accomplish.

Other symbolic meanings

In Greek mythology, the Partridge first appears in a tragic tale involving jealousy.

The Partridge is a bird that is scared of heights and in the Christian bible it is stated: "As the partridge sitteth on eggs, and hatcheth them not; so he that getteth riches, and not by right, shall leave them in the midst of his days, and at his end shall be a fool". (Jeremiah 17:11, King James Bible).



Day 2

**On the second day of Christmas, my true love
said to me, 'Two turtle doves'.**

Turtle Doves - In Egyptian, Roman and Chinese societies, doves symbolized innocence, long life, peace, devotion and love, and caring for one's family.

Turtle doves spend winters in Africa and breed in Europe, Asia and the Middle East. Turtle doves are graceful creatures.

Gracefulness is therefore associated with 'true love', but in modern times, love has been maligned to disgraceful practices under a system of enslavement and entrapment of young women.

Turtle doves symbolize love and faithfulness because they mate for life, work together to build nests and raise their young together.

The Turtle Doves are a representation that love should be graceful, and we should be proud of love and falling in love.

Other symbolic meanings

The Bible depicts doves as loyal, honest and loving. However, In Leviticus 12:8, two turtle doves replaced a

lamb sacrifice, and Mary and Joseph sacrificed two turtle doves in Jerusalem at Christ's birth.

So, we see Christianity transform a historically and culturally significant creature of gracefulness and delight into a sacrifice. Just like the Christian Jesus, Love became a sacrifice.

The implication of sacrificing a creature depicted as loyal, honest, and loving is the acceptance of the opposite of these virtues. It means that humanity has forgone loyalty for betrayal, honesty for deceptiveness, and love for hatred or wickedness.

Love adored, becomes a thing sacrificed.



Day 3

On the third day of Christmas, my true love said to me, 'Three French Hens'.

Three French Hens - Hope, Faith and Love are symbolized by three French hens code named Coulette, Poulette and Fifi in the book 'Three French Hens a holiday tale'.

The hens were originally sent from a Mademoiselle from Paris to Philippe Renard, but ended up being delivered to Phil Fox, the wrong destination. Phil Fox plans to devour them for breakfast, lunch and dinner.

Faith, Hope and Love - These symbolisms can be said to represent different aspects of humanity. If 'Faith' is misplaced, hope and love would be misdirected. If 'Hope' is lost, faith and love would be hopeless, and if 'Love' is in vain, faith and hope would be fruitless.

In other words, we have misplaced priorities in our world and our strive for vanity, greed and destructive practices places our world at risk.

We need to develop a consciousness of what is truly important to the sustainability of our world and the kind of

balance we truly need to achieve our original divine programming of attaining the heavens.

The accension to the heavens is currently expressed in aeronautic science and space exploration. However, we still lack balance in our world.

Considering the original distribution of the races, we can see significant disbalance in humanities development. Everyone was supposed to bring something to the round table, some unique idea, process, or concept.

Other symbolic meanings

In the Anglo-Celtic pagans' culture, the French hens represent the three aspects of the Mother Goddess: virgin, mother, and hag.

Just like the three French hens, has religion been wrongly distributed globally? Or has religion misdirected us globally?



Day 4

On the fourth day of Christmas, my true love said to me, 'Four calling Birds'.

The Number 4 - The number 4 represents 'Being'. It is the number that connects mind-body-spirit with the physical world of structure and organization.

Mind, body, and spirit, connected to a physical world of structure and organization is an extension of the divine programming for the true kings or queens. The programming aims for the heavens. Primitively, this was expressed in cruel labor and later replaced with religious devotion. In modern times, we observe a more realistic approach to the attainment of the heavens in aeronautics and space exploration.

Number 4 symbolizes safety and security of home, stability and strength on a solid foundation of values and beliefs. 4, 44, 444, have angelic significance.

This implies that in our aspirations to the heavens, we need to consider the safety and security of our home. Home is where mother is, and mother is mother earth.

Ensuring the safety and security of earth would give us stability and strength in our human journey of ascension.

Have you ever felt or noticed something significant about angel numbers like 111, 444, or 555?

I used to see spiritual significance in the number 111 appearing on my clock, computer, and books. Then I noticed the mysterious 0, often appearing as 1101 or 1011 (4 significant numbers).

There are numerous religious references of the significance of the number 4.

Calling or Coaly - Birds are naturally known to call out in songs and Coaly was an early English term for black. So, it is likely that the original term in this carol was '4 coaly birds'. This means 4 black birds.

Blackbirds are middle sized birds with a beautiful singing voice and their natural habitat is in Europe, Asia, Africa and New Zealand.

Blackbirds have black feathers, red wings and yellow beaks. They stay awake at night, a skill useful to escape predators and gather food. Blackbirds as a totem represent knowledge, carriers of intelligence and quick wit.

Singing or music is a strong carrier of messages from generation to generation. The use of poems and literary

works has been used to preserve messages and culture through time.

Music is also a general expression of the state of living, concepts, or activities that are predominant in each period.

Sometimes a single line or phrase in a song resonates deeply in my core and stirs up a sequence of memory-like messages or revelations. Just like this Christmas carol did.

For example, in Taylor Swift's song titled 'Blank Space' I heard the words '*Are we going to live forever or is it all going to go down in flames.*' Intuitively, I heard this statement as a reference to the world and a warning to correct our destructive practices.

Another example is Alec Baldwin's song titled 'Let me down slowly', where he used the phrase '*I once was a man with dignity and grace.*' I intuitively associated this statement with the falling race of humanity and the need to realign our priorities.

There have been many occasions where I felt triggered by the sounds of music and many times it was a very strong message or feeling. I have come to believe that music is a sought of programming in the human mind that keeps us connected to Mother earth and the direction of our human race journey.

Other symbolic meanings

The Serbian name for Kosovo, was given based on the name of a blackbird (kos).

The blackbird is so significant, that it is the national bird of Sweden! Sweden naturally falls under the 'Nordic alliance', the home of Thor, the God of Thunder and Lighting.

The Nordic alliance includes Denmark (red and white), Sweden (Yellow and blue), Finland (White and Blue), Norway (Red, White and blue), Iceland (Red, white, and blue) as well as Faroe Islands, Greenland, and the Aland islands.

There is a significant need for realignment and connection with mother nature.



Day 5

On the fifth day of Christmas, my true love said to me, 'Five Gold Rings'.

The Number 5 - The number 5 is commonly referred to as the number of humanity. Humans have 5 fingers, 5 toes, 5 appendages, 5 senses, and 5 major systems of the body. Hence, we can refer to five as significant to proper coordination in life.

There are 5 books in the Torah and 5 pillars of Islam, and David collected 5 smooth stones to defeat the giant Goliath.

The pentagram is a significant symbol in many religions including Taoism, and the Pythagoreans believed the number 5 to be the number resembling a marriage between the earth and heavens.

In Tarot, the Hierophant (or priest) card is associated with 5, and the card in the major arcana is noted for bridging the Gap between the physical and spiritual worlds.

In astrology, 5 is associated with Mercury, the planet of intelligence, logic, awareness, communication, and ideas, and in the zodiac, the 5th sign is Leo.

Hermes was a Greek God associated with planet Mercury, he was the messenger of the Gods, and he wore winged

shoes to help him travel quickly between them. Hermes was very intelligent, gathering bits of information here and there and playing tricks as well as the Lyre. Hermes has similar characteristics with Thor.

5 Rings - The most common symbolism of 5 rings is in the Olympics flag with the colors of blue, yellow, black, green, and red rings on white background, each ring appears to represent the five continents of Europe, Asia, Africa, America and Australia.

The six colors (including the white background) can be combined to reproduce the colors of every country without exception; a truly international emblem. The Olympics originated from ancient Greece and was held in honor of the God Zeus.

Gold Rings in Folklore - There are many tales of gold rings available online, but it's not the lure of gold that's the main point of the stories.

In the story of 'The Fish and the Ring', a wicked baron tries to destroy a love prophecy by demanding from the bride the return of his gold ring which he had thrown into the sea. The bride receives the returned ring by fate in the stomach of a fish.

In the story of 'Prince Ring', a prince and his men hunted a hind with a golden ring on its horns. The hind was killed, and the prince was cursed with darkness. The story is a fantasy tale of a prince transformed into a dog seeking redemption.

Naturally, the killing of such a mysterious hind, must have been a taboo, likely to have occurred in an excluded part of the forest or according to some African cultures, in the forbidden forest.

These stories can be found in Lang's fairy books, the Grimms fairy tales, Herodotus, the histories, and other online sources.

An Italian Myth - In Italy, Befana la Strega (Befana the witch) comes on the evening of the 5th of January, Epiphany Eve. She travels on a broomstick and delivers sweets or other gifts to all children who have behaved. Children who have misbehaved will receive a black candy that represents a lump of coal.

There's a natural golden circle spring formation in Iceland, which has water erupting like a volcano and there's also an Islamic ring found in a 9th-century Viking grave, bearing an Arabic inscription 'il-la-la' translated as "for/to Allah".

Revelations – In a revelation I was asked; *‘What use is Gold if you can't buy food?’*

Therefore, I substituted 'Gold for Crop' and Ring for Circle' which gave the term 'Crop Circles'.

Crop circles are an area of standing crops that has been flattened in the form of a circle or more complex pattern. Crop circles are a strange phenomenon still under investigation and thought to be caused by alien activity.

Another question I was asked is; *‘What use is Gold if you can't breathe?’* and *‘How can we breathe if we don't have trees?’*

Consequently, I could deduce that the '5 gold rings' can be interpreted as '5 crop circles' and could be referring to a message from the earth about the trees.

A warning against potential damage to vegetation or crops. The degradation of the ecological system which is one of the major causes of climate change and global warming.



Day 6

**On the sixth day of Christmas, my true love said
to me, 'Six geese are laying'.**

The Number 6 - The number 6 is considered the most harmonious of single-digit numbers.

The number 6 refers to internal balance in life, rather than being too outwardly focused to the detriment of your internal and spiritual life. A shift of perspective from striving for material things, to one of contentment.

Number 6 also refers to the use of the sixth sense or intuition to solve problems. It is also considered as a message from angels not to hold any fear concerning your material situation and through harmony between material and spiritual aspects of life, find peace and freedom from fear and doubt.

Number 6 is nicknamed the motherhood number and biblically, man was created on the sixth day, to provide balance, protection, direction and harmony to all the other creations.

With great power comes great responsibility, hence man has a responsibility to cater to the earth.

The Goose - The goose is a bird of any of several waterfowl species in the family Anatidae. Goose is female while Gander is male. Geese are monogamous and live in permanent pairs throughout the year, a reflection of 'True-Love'. Geese only lay eggs in the spring.

Springtime is a symbolic reference to the season and ideas of rebirth, rejuvenation, renewal, resurrection and re-growth. Spring brings sunshine.

The Gray Goose Laws - Grey symbolizes 'Old' or 'Wise', which is a symbolic reference to grey hairs on an elderly person.

There is a legendary old woman from Norse mythology, called Mother Goose who wrote rhymes for children.

If we substitute 'Mother for Goose' and 'Old or Wise for Gray', we will get 'Old/Wise Mother Laws', which infers a symbolic reference to 'Mother Earth Laws'.

One of the available quotes online referenced to the Old Mother laws is as follows.

"Wilderness is our store...And it's getting smaller. Everything in it is premium quality and it's free. How many places like this do you have left?" ~ Gwichin grandmother, Yukon (available from angelajanehoward.com).

However, this author couldn't find any copy of the 'Grey goose laws' without Christian and modern Norwegian influence.

Some popular sayings – There are many popular sayings relating to goose and some of the most common sayings are.

- *'What is good for the goose is good for the gander'* – This saying is symbolic of equal rights between female and male species. It is a symbolic reference to stop gender discrimination and advance the emancipation of feminine gender and equality in our society.
- *'Killing the goose that lays the golden eggs'* - This saying from an old Aesop fable, is a reference to any greed-motivated, unprofitable action that destroys or otherwise renders a favorable situation useless. This could be a reference to humanity's destruction of Earth.
As our location on its habitable surface is supposed to be a favorable situation that assists our pursuit of heavenly ascension or space travel.
- *'A wild goose chase'* – This saying refers to a useless and futile waste of time and effort. This could refer to man's interest in space travel, without first seeking balance on Earth, which is our favorable position.

In a song by Damian Marley and Nas titled 'Patience', the following lyrics are used *'Plant a flag on the moon, when you can't find food for the starving tummies'*.

Angelica - Angelica is an herbal plant which was instrumental to the treatment of the bubonic plague. It is considered an anti-bacterial and can treat stomach problems and prevent ulcers. It is also considered an anti-viral used in the prevention and treatment of respiratory problems and has been claimed to inhibit the growth of cancerous cells.

The Gray goose laws lay out punishment for stealing Angelica and moss, and your wealth was measured by how much Angelica you had on your property.

This use of the herbal plant, Angelica, as a reference to wealth is like the symbolic meanings in 'Day 5' (Gold means nothing without plants). It could also symbolize that health is more important than wealth.

The Angelica plant has strong and rich roots, juicy sweet stalk, and delicious leaves. It has been considered a life saver, along with Icelandic moss, over centuries of famine and sickness in Iceland, and it can influence the taste of meat from animals that graze on it.

Folklore - In Norse mythology, Thorgeir and his brother Thormod, were in the Icelandic mountains picking Angelica for their soups, salads, and medicinal remedies, when Thorgeir slipped from a cliff but held on to an Angelica plant, which has well anchored roots, until Thormod rushed to save him.

It is likely that Thorgeir and Thormod are male and female like Thor and Hermes.

The proverb 'make hay while the sun shines', means you must take advantage of the chance to do something while the conditions are good or favorable. This 6th day is a call from Mother Earth to be more responsible towards the environment, Trees and Oceans because they would protect us from the heat of the Sun and serve as a base to the other planets in the solar system. It is a strong warning against global warming and climate change.



Day 7

**On the seventh day of Christmas, my true love
said to me, 'Seven swans are swimming'.**

The Number 7 - The number 7 is much more prevalent in nature than most people realize.

There are 7 oceans, 7 continents, 7 neck vertebrae, 7 skin layers, 7 rainbow colors, 7 sound notes, 7 head holes, 7 weekdays, 7 classical planets, 7 hills in Istanbul, 7 hills in Rome, 7 hills in Jerusalem, 7 liberal arts, 7 wonders of the ancient world, and the Jewish menorah has 7 candles.

7 is the number of completeness and perfection. It derives much of its meaning from being tied directly to God's creation of all things in the Bible. The number 7 also considered significant in Hinduism, Islam and Judaism.

Swans - Swans are birds of the family Anatidae, the same family as the Goose. Swans usually mate for life and are often a symbol of love or fidelity because of their long-lasting apparently monogamous relationship. This implies that Swans are also a reference to true love.

The English word 'Swan' is derived from Indo-European root 'Swen' which means 'to sound/sing'.

Swans are the largest extant of waterfowl family and among the largest flying birds. They have teeth for catching and eating fish.

Swans are intimately associated with the divine twins in Indo-European religions and were a solar symbol in proto-Indo-European times.

'Thorgeir and Thormod', 'Thor and Hermes', and 'Apollo and Artemis' are also symbolically associated with the divine twins. The divine twins are also a reference to the creation of man and woman in the beginning and the concept of twins is used to insinuate equality.

The 'Swan song' is a metaphorical phrase for a final gesture, effort, or performance given just before death or retirement. The phrase references ancient beliefs that swans sing a beautiful song just before their death, having been silent most of their lifetime. For example, an athlete that wins a championship or breaks a record in the final season is sometimes said to have had a 'Swan Song' season.

Folklore - The Swan appears in several fairy tales, poems and stories from folklore.

One of such stories is 'The Ugly Duckling'. This is a story of a little bird born in a barnyard who suffers abuse from other

ducks until, much to his delight, he matures into a beautiful Swan, the most beautiful bird of all.

This story is beloved around the world as a tale about personal transformation for the better. It can be considered as an allude to a better world out of the chaos of discrimination, racism, differences and environmental pollution.

Let's have a 'Swan Song' Mother Earth says, let's make things right and rebuild the balance of the world to checkmate potential disasters like climate change and global warming.

Today, five flying swans are the symbol of the Nordic Countries, the whooper swan is the national bird of Finland, and the mute Swan is the national bird of Denmark.

Swans are revered in Hinduism and are compared to saintly persons whose chief characteristics is to be in the world without getting attached to it, just as a Swan's feather does not get wet when it's in water.

Ballet's lead dual roles of Odette (White swan) and Odile (Black swan) represent good and evil, like the Chinese Ying Yang.

This concept of dualism describes how seemingly opposite or contrary forces may be complementary, interconnected, and interdependent in the natural world, and how they may give rise to each other as they interrelate to one another.

The application of the concept of dualism in our world is deeply rooted in the cohabitation of the Angelic and Demonic essence or human vessels. This cohabitation is the central topic of a different book by this same author.

In Chinese cosmology, the universe creates itself out of a primary chaos of material energy organized into circles of yin yang and formed into objects and lives. This is a similar concept to the 'battle of the Gods on Mount Olympus and refers to the multiplication of life through rebirth.

The complementary interrelation between white and black can also be alluded to Mother Earth's desire for 'World Peace', and a hint towards preventing the reoccurrence of space battles projected in past life memory movies like 'Star Wars' and 'Star trek'.

The concept of past life memories is the central topic of a different book by this same author.

By first seeking balance in world peace, humanity would fare better in space exploration.

Day 8

**On the eighth day of Christmas, my true love said
to me,
'Eight maids are milking'.**

The Number 8 - The number 8 is the symbol of resurrection and regeneration. It symbolizes new beginnings.

Number 8 denotes a new order or creation, because 8 comes after 7 (the number of completion), which implies that 8 is associated with the beginning of a new era or new order.

God rested on the 7th day and the 8th day was a new beginning. There are 8 beatitudes in the bible and 8 persons were in Noah's ark to create a new beginning for mankind.

A bronze anniversary celebrates the 8th year of a wedding. The Latin word for 8 is 'Octo' and the amount of clouds in the sky is measured in Oktas, with 8 Oktas representing complete cloud cover.

Most umbrellas have 8 sides, and an Octagon has 8 sides. The Stop sign has 8 sides. A computer byte is 8 bits and 8 is the atomic number for oxygen.

Spiders have 8 legs and Octopus have 8 arms. The math symbol for infinity is like 8 written sideways. There are 8 fluids ounces in a cup and 8 pints make a gallon. There are 8 original reindeer of Santa and 8 minutes for the sun's rays to reach earth.

Angel number 888 reminds us of the importance of aligning our intentions with our higher purpose in life, and it's a sign that abundance will soon be coming your way.

The number 8 is also strongly related to self-confidence and self-belief. The number resonates with the concept of Karma (What you give, you get).

In China, the number 8 is considered a very lucky number for prosperity, and the 8th day of the Chinese New Year is the day for the annual gathering of all the gods in heaven.

In Tarot, 8 is the card for justice and strength, and it has a strong reference to inner strength and determination.

Maids are milking - The 8th day presents a shift from the symbolic use of 'Birds' to 'Human' characters in the Carol.

In ancient days, owning animals that produced milk was a great sign of wealth, and wealth has been associated with crops in the previous sections.

To have milk producing animals, there must be an abundance of grazing fields or crops for the animals.

In 15th and 16th century England, the phrase 'let's go-a-milking' was a euphemism for 'let's get married', hence this 8th day is also a reference to love and romance.

The term to 'go-a-milking' had strong romantic and sexual connotations, like similar slang expressions used by people today, it was a code used by men to test a woman's response to their intentions. The term maid is also a shortened form of maiden, 'a young, unmarried, woman'.

By combining the images of maiden and milk (breast feeding) we'd get an image of reproduction from a new union which symbolizes a new beginning.

The term '8 maids a milking' also evokes images of food. Until the advent of refrigeration, milk was not a common drink because it spoiled quickly, but milk-based products that did not spoil, like cheese, sour milk and custards were prized treats.

Therefore, the term 'maids are milking', could also refer to a period of celebration or an important party where prized food would be consumed.

We can assume that the expected change to 'Human' characters from the 'Birds' of the first 7 days was supposed to bring about a new beginning of prosperity, peace, and celebration.

Folklore - In the fairy tale 'Maid Maleen', Maleen is in love with a charming prince, but her father has someone else in mind for her.

As punishment for refusing her father's choice, she is locked up along with her maidservant in a sealed tower with enough food to last for 7 years.

After 7 long years, the food runs out, but no one comes to release or deliver more food to them. So Maleen and her maidservant break out, only to find the kingdom destroyed and the king long gone.

The Maleen tale begins where many fairytales end (fallen in love), and after 7 years she breaks free to start a new beginning in the 8th year.

Sayings - '*Behind the eight*' is an English expression implying that one is in an embarrassing situation, out of luck or in trouble. This corresponds with the Chinese association of prosperity to the number 8.

On this 8th day, we see love being restricted and hidden like some taboo requiring coded language.

From monogamous birds representing true love, to Men who want to 'go-a-milking' (casual sex or irresponsible slangs language).

Therefore, the 8th day could also refer to the fall or demise of true love at the hands of man. Just like the Maleen tale which is symbolic of destruction that arises from the death of true love.

This author considers love as a key to the betterment of humanity and the world's systems at large. Not just love for a spouse but love for one another and respect for each other's values that can help humanity overcome racism, gender discrimination and environmental degradation.

How could it be forbidden, if it's love?



Day 9

On the ninth day of Christmas, my true love said to me, 'Nine ladies dancing'.

The Number 9 - Number 9 is the number of universal Love, and it symbolizes a lot of things including eternity, faith, universal spiritual laws, the concept of Karma, spiritual enlightenment, spiritual awakening, service to humanity, leading by example, philanthropy and a higher perspective.

The qualities of 9 are those of leadership, the ability to see clearly, integration, and the three worlds (Physical, Intellectual, and Spiritual).

There are 9 worlds in Norse mythology and in Hinduism 9 is the number of Brahma, the creator. The 9th day of the Chinese New Year is the birthday of the Jade emperor, who supposedly rules all heaven and earth and is worshipped by Taoists.

In Tarot 9 is the card of Hermit, which symbolizes self-examination and reflection.

The 9 bows were used to symbolize enemies in ancient Egypt.

In Viking culture, the father had to recognize a newborn child on the 9th night and there is a popular superstition about Cats having 9 lives.

The Baha'i use the 9-pointed star as a symbol of their faith and their house of worship has 9 sides.

The 9-pointed star may also symbolize 9 great religions of the world: Baha'i, Buddhism, Christianity, Hinduism, Islam, Jainism, Judaism, Shinto and Sikhism.

The Christian apostle Paul, wrote about 9 fruits of the spirit, and the 9th hour is considered the hour of prayer.

Jesus died during the 9th hour, and in Catholicism a novena is said for 9 days.

Sayings - The nine of diamonds is called *'The Curse of Scotland'* which refers to a proverb observing 9 or 9th to be a bad Omen in Scottish history.

'Nine times to the Devil' is a superstitious belief in England that parsley went 9 times to the devil and back before it started to sprout.

Folklore - In Norse mythology, Odin, the chief of the gods hung himself in Yggdrasil (tree of life) where he spent nine days and nine nights hanging in the tree. In a similar fashion, Jesus Christ also died on the cross at the 9th hour.

It is claimed that Odin made this sacrifice of himself to gain power over the runes and learn all their secrets.

However, this author believes that Odin realized that he was a very strong spiritual being who had adverse effects (e.g. being followed by thunder and lightning) on the physical plain, so he tried to reduce his powers as a way of reducing or stopping the interference with the physical journey of man, the human race's journey of ascension into the heavens.

In Greek mythology, the 9 muses were the daughters of Zeus and Mnemosyne who had a love affair that lasted 9 nights. They were goddesses who inspired gifted artists, musicians, dancers and authors.

The Greek goddess Demeter, went for 9 days and 9 nights searching for her beloved daughter, Core.

The Greek goddess of the night, Leto, had to suffer horrific pains of labor for 9 days and 9 nights before giving birth to the twins, Artemis (goddess of hunting) and Apollo (god of music and prophecy).

Other Symbolic meanings of the number 9

Lady Jane Grey was queen of England for 9 days, before she was beheaded for treason.

The 9th president of the U.S.A. was William H. Harrison, and he was the first to die in office.

Beethoven wrote 9 symphonies, and the melody of the European anthem is from Beethoven's 9th Symphony. Europe day is May 9th of each year, and it was on May 9th, 1950, that Robert Schuman presented the proposal of the United Europe.

The double 9th festival is an old Chinese tradition celebrated on the 9th day of the lunar month, also dedicated to senior citizens in Taiwan.

The number 9 symbolizes leadership, but it also has some negative associations, which might probably indicate that leadership among humans isn't heading in the right direction.

The negative associations of day 9 could also arise because of failure to create a proper new beginning on day 8.

Our world moves in circles and each new circle is an opportunity to correct the mistakes of the past circle. Although, some people misconstrue the cyclical nature of life as a need to keep the wheel turning by maintaining status quo.

The only failure is a failure to correct mistakes.

Day 10

On the tenth day of Christmas, my true love said to me, 'Ten lords a-leaping'.

The Number 10 - The number 10 is a combination of 1 (symbol of self-leadership, authority and initiative) and 0 (number of eternity and spiritual life).

10 is a symbol of the authority, obedience and responsibility of people towards laws.

There are 10 commandments of God, given to Moses and to 10 different generations in the Christian bible.

The number 10 also symbolizes 10 nations who were always hostile towards Israel and the biblical end-time beast representing evil has 10 toes and 10 horns.

10 plagues were sent on ancient Egypt to free the Israelites from the bondage of slavery.

The Passover lamb was on the 10th day of the 1st month, and the 10th day of the 7th month is the day of atonement.

Number 10 is considered the most perfect of all numbers because it contains the unit (1) which makes it distinct and zero (0) which represents matter and chaos.

The number 10 also symbolizes created and non-created, power and force, life and nothing, and beginning and end. Number 10 indicates the first couple with 1 representing man and 0 representing the egg fertilized by man.

Binary numbers 1's and 0's are the basic creation language in computer programs.

The number 10 also refers to the Androgyne nature of being male and female simultaneously.

The philosopher Agrippa called 10, a number representing all or universal that marks the full journey of life.

The Mayans explained this numerology as the end of a circle and the beginning of another circle.

The Number 10 also symbolizes life and death. A rebirth of 1 no longer standing alone but combined with the mystical number 0.

In Tarot, 10 is the card of the Wheel of Fortune, symbolizing the beginning of a new circle, and it could also indicate receiving an unexpected fortune, although when reversed it indicates bad luck and change for the worse.

Number 10 is the highest possible score in the Olympics and the top rim of the basketball goal net is 10ft. The

number 10 in football is usually associated with a creative midfielder (e.g. Zidane, Okocha, Ronaldinho, Messi).

Number 10 Downing street is the residence and office of the prime minister of UK. Neon has atomic number 10. The length of your hand is 1/10 of your total height and the 'Richter scale' is tenfold.

Noah was known as the 10th patriarch and there were 10 generations before the great flood. There were 10 virgins and 10 talents in the book of Matthew and Christian tithes is 10% of one's income.

Kabbalists believe there are 10 fundamental forces, 10 sefirot that flow from God to his creation and God continues to create by combining the 10 sefirot.

Hinduism teaches that the god Vishnu will be reincarnated 10 times (already reincarnated 9 times) and the final 10th expected to see him arriving riding on a white horse at the end of Kali Yuga (present times) to destroy all evil and bring a new age 'Satya Yuga'. This is like the Christian belief of a second coming of Jesus. Furthermore, the Sikhs believe in 10 gurus as a guide in their devotions.

Folklore - The gods associated with number 10 are the Greek Atlas who bears the weight of the world on his

shoulders and Uranus who is deeply concerned with technology and imagination.

The philosopher and scientist 'Pythagoras' said 10 is the symbol of the universe and that it expressed the entire human knowledge.

Odysseus (Greek) or Ulysses (Roman) had a 10-year journey back home to Ithaca and his wife, Penelope, after fighting in the war of Troy which lasted 10 years.

Lords - 'Lord' is a title for a person or deity who has authority, control, or power over others. A lord acts like a master, a chief, or a ruler.

The word, Lord, can be traced back to the old English word hlaford/hlafweard meaning "Loaf-ward" or "Bread keeper", which references the Germanic tribal custom of a chieftain providing food for his followers.

The title 'Lord' is masculine while 'Lady' is its feminine counterpart. However, this is no longer universal: the 'Lord of Mann', is a title currently held by the Queen of the United Kingdom, and female 'Lord Mayors' are examples of women who are styled 'Lord'.

The collective 'Lords' refers to a group of peers in leadership position e.g. 'House of Lords' the upper parliament of UK.

'A-Leaping' - A-leaping simply means jumping up and down. A-leaping also refers to a children's game originating from the time of Henry VIII, as an exercise performed by men in the upper class during bad weather.

In the game, players line up and bent forwards holding their legs below the knee, while the last on queue jumps over each person until he gets to the front of the line.

Leaping was also popular in dance especially within the upper classes back in 1500s. A leap was known as a 'common bound'.

There's a picture which hangs in Penshurst palace in England and depicts the Earl of Leicester dancing a-leaping La Volta with queen Elizabeth I.

From the preceding sections, we can infer that 10 Lord's can refer to 10 leaders, kings or rulers in the world, either physical or spiritual, male or female (1 & 0).

The reference of Lords (Leaders), a-leaping (Kids play), could be an indication of irresponsible leadership and a call

to more responsibility from the world's leaders, following insight provided from day 1 to 9.

Alternatively, Lords (leaders), a-leaping (dancing), could be a reference of relaxation from the work of leadership and acknowledgement of a period of celebration expressed in dancing, which is usually associated with parties. Afterall, yuletide is a season of celebrations.

Therefore, Day 10 is a symbolic call for responsible leadership and governance around the world.



Day 11

**On the eleventh day of Christmas, my true love
said to me, 'Eleven pipers piping'.**

The Number 11 - The number 11 is a master number that resonates at an extremely high vibration multiplying the attributes of 1 to a higher power. Number 11 carries a vibrational frequency of balance representing male and female equality.

Seeing 11 often implies Angelic communication and 11 is associated with faith and psychics. Number 11 also represents a transmutation of your personal power to a higher and more spiritual level.

Number 11 implies a responsibility to use your skills, talents, or leadership position to help others.

It is also associated with the universe sending a message of 'Confirmation to maintain integrity', 'Enter into an open space of conscious awareness', and 'realign, reaffirm, or re-establish (re-balance) ourselves.

Number 11 comes after 10 (which represents law and responsibility), 11 then represents the opposite which is irresponsibility of breaking the law, which brings disorder and judgment.

The 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month is 'Remembrance Day' honored in all parts of the commonwealth, and the 11th day of the 11th month is still considered Global God's Day.

Eleven Pipers piping - Eleven pipers piping simply means 11 musicians playing wind instruments.

A Piper could also refer to a musician who plays the bagpipes. Bagpipes are a woodwind instrument using enclosed reeds fed from a constant reservoir of air in the form of a bag.

The Scottish Great Highland bagpipes are the best known in the Anglophone world; however, bagpipes have been played for a millennium or more throughout large parts of Europe, northern Africa, and Western Asia, including Anatolia, the Caucasus, and around the Persian Gulf.

Folklore - One of the most famous fairy tales of a Piper is the 'Pied Piper of Hamelin', which is the titular character of a legend from the town of Hamelin' (Lower Saxon, Germany).

The legend dates to the Middle Ages, the earliest references describing a Piper, dressed in multicolored ("pied") clothing, who was a ratcatcher hired by the town to lure rats away with his magical pipe.

When the citizens refused to pay for the Piper's service, he retaliated by using his instrument's magical power on their children, leading them away as he had done to the rats.

Some theories have linked the disappearance of the children to 'mass psychogenic illness' in the form of 'Dancing Mania'. Dancing mania was a social phenomenon that occurred primarily in mainland Europe between the 14th and 17th centuries. It involved groups of people dancing erratically, sometimes thousands at a time. The mania affected men, women, and children who danced until they collapsed from exhaustion.

Outbreaks of dancing mania occurred during the 13th century, including one in 1237 in which a large group of children travelled from Erfurt to Arnstadt (approx. 20km), jumping and dancing all the way.

This linkage of missing children to 'mass psychogenic illness' assumes that in past times all people of a town were referred to as 'children of the town'.

There are various interpretations of the Pied Piper tale, including 'Emigration', 'Hope from plagues', and 'Colonization'.

If we put the story into the context of the 'Twelve days of Christmas', we see 11 coming after 10 (law and

responsibility) which gave a conclusion of 'A call for more responsible Government'.

Following the conclusion with the number 11 (Chaos, disorder and Judgment) leads us to a tale of broken promises and failure to pay a laborer his just wages, leading to the disappearance of 130 children/Townspeople, surely a situation of chaos.

The linkage shows that irresponsibility (number 10) leads to chaos (number 11).

Revelations - In Day 10, 'a-leaping' was also used in reference to dancing, and here in Day 11, we are led to 'Dancing Mania' an affliction resulting from being misdirected or misguided.

We are pre-programmed or coded to go in a certain direction physically and relating to the future direction of space travels in unity and harmony. We all have our Angelic (organic) or Demonic (Scientific) associations (spirit man).

Solomon appointed 12 officers over Israel and in Israel, the high priest's breastplate had 12 stones embedded.

12, is the number of primary followers of great master's in history including Jesus Christ, Prophet Muhammad (pbh), Pontiff Maximus, St. Francis of Assisi, Confucius, Mithra, Ali, Odin, and Napoleon.

There are 12 major gods of Olympus in Greek mythology and 12 gods of Egypt. There were also 12 tables of Achilles' shield.

The egg of Osiris contains 12 white pyramids representing good, and twelve black pyramids representing evil. This is another symbolic reference to the interwoven nature of good and evil expressed in Chinese Ying Yang, and the intended cohabitation of Angelic and Demonic essence in humanity.

Hercules had 12 tasks, and the Chinese horoscope has 12 animals. There are 12 names of the sun in sanskrit (mantras).

There are 12 verses of the emerald table from Egypt attributed to Hermes Trismegist and in Tarot, 12 is the card of the hanged man, a symbol of self-sacrifice and meditation.

12 is a number that signifies what is completed, forming a whole, perfection and represents harmony.

Drummers drumming - A drummer is a person who plays the drums.

In Africa, drums hold deeper symbolic and historical significance, heralding political and social events and attending to ceremonies of birth, death and marriage. Drums are known to accompany religious rites and rituals, calling up ancestral spirits. They can inspire passion and excitement and even cause trances.

Folklore - Fairy tales relating to 12 include 'The 12 dancing princesses', 'The 12 brothers' and 'The 12 sisters'.

In the Asian tale of 12 sisters, their bankrupt father abandoned the 12 sisters deep in the forest with 12 packs of rice, which when opened, had 11 containing sand and only 1 contained rice. The 12 sisters had to share this 1 bag among themselves.
